As a First Year Member

As I approached graduation in April of 2005, I felt that after five years in college I was finally prepared to take the step into “the real world.” Everything seemed to fall into place rather nicely. I wasn’t in jeopardy of failing any classes and I had multiple job prospects in the Pittsburgh area; however, one thing still sat in the back of my mind as a reason not to leave school.

The marching band was the reason I chose Pitt coming out of high school. After marching here for five years and in high school for five years prior to that, I had no idea what I was going to do with my life now that it was approaching the end.

In the months that I contemplated this question, the PBAC visited band practices to talk to seniors about staying involved with the band after graduation. It is these alumni who know the traditions of the University and can be sure that we are always staying true to our past as well as looking to improve our future.
